The Parish Council would like to reiterate its thanks to Highway Assurance Limited for their weekly contribution of £150.00 towards the cost of DK9. The Parish Council would like to invite any other businesses in Barham to make a contribution towards the DK9 fee. If we were able to encourage more funding then we might be able to afford to reinstate the full 7 days a week.
