### **AGGRESSIVE DOGS IN BARHAM**



It has been brought to the attention of the Parish Council that there are some dogs in the village which are out of control and threatening towards the public. This has been observed by walkers and runners who have been intimidated by threatening dog behaviour recently when out and about. This is causing apprehension and anxiety to the public and ruining the experiences and enjoyment of being outside and exploring the natural environment.

KEEP YOUR DOG UNDER CONTROL.

Anyone can report a dog and their owner to the police and also to the local council dog warden service.

Dog fouling is also a concern in Barham – PLEASE CLEAN UP AFTER YOUR DOG HAS BEEN TO THE TOILET. It is an offence not to do so and should also be reported to the local council (Mid-Suffolk & Babergh District Council)
